## **MEMORY VERSE**

II Timothy 3:16-17

"All scripture is God breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."

The word "Bible" comes from the Greek word "biblos," meaning book. The Bible, divided into the Old and New Testaments, is a compilation of 66 different books written by 44 authors.

A testament refers to a treaty, pact or covenant. The Old Testament scriptures, written in the Hebrew language, were given to the Jews, the Hebrews, the physical descendants of Abraham. The Old Testament covers history, God's law, and the terms of God's relationship with man from the creation to the coming of the Messiah (who would establish the New Covenant).

The New Testament consists of the terms of the New Covenant, which God has made with those who surrender their lives to His Son Jesus Christ. The New Testament, written in Greek, covers the life, death and resurrection of Christ, His teachings, the apostles, the early church, and the future coming of the Messiah.
