THE HOLY SPIRIT--THE GIFT OF GOD

MEMORY VERSE

Mark 16:17-18

"And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well."

The Holy Spirit is a pledge or an engagement ring of promise. He is given to us as a promise from God that He will redeem us completely—body, soul and spirit. It is a promise of full redemption in order that we might be a holy and perfect dwelling place for God in the Spirit so that we might be transformed into the very image of Jesus. The degree to which we are controlled by the Spirit of God at the beginning of our Christian walk is but a mere seed of what will one day flood our whole being and cause those who go on to be with the Lord to be filled with the fullness of resurrection life.

The Amplified Bible says it this way:

That Spirit is the guarantee of our inheritance—the firstfruit, the pledge and Foretaste, the down payment of our heritage—in anticipation of its full Redemption and our acquiring complete possession of it.
